Autumn Term Learning Letter 2023

In English we are learning to write a character description based on a very grumpy owl from our main text 'Big bad owl'. We will develop our knowledge of adjectives and build great descriptive sentences. We will read 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse' and write a letter from mouse to the other. We will use persuasive language and our best punctuation.

We will also write information about country farm animals using our best conjunctions.

In Maths we are learning all about place value.

We will consider what the digits in a two-digit number mean. We will use new strategies and apparatus to add and subtract one digit and two-digit numbers more efficiently and learn that repeated addition can be written as a multiplication. We will begin to understand how to tell the time to O Clock, Half past, Quarter past and quarter to the hour.

In Art we are learning to mix colours, tints, tones and shades as we attempt to reimagine the work of David Hockney.

We will study his amazing countryside landscapes and discuss his work in depth before creating our own pieces of art.

**Our Learning Theme is ...
'The Countryside'**

In RE we are learning all about the Muslim faith.

We will consider the beliefs and practices that are important to Muslims.

We will hear stories from the Quran and consider what Muslim people learn from them.

In Geography we are learning to recognize landmarks from aerial photographs and devise maps with symbols.

We will be looking at photographs of our local countryside 'Werneth Low' and comparing the countryside to towns and cities.

We hope to plan a trip to the local woods too so we can conduct fieldwork.

In Science we are learning to name a range of animals and consider what they need in order to stay healthy.

We will concentrate on mini beasts and observe them in their natural environments. We will observe how these creatures move, what they eat and think about why their habitats are suitable.

In RHE/ PSHE we are learning to understand why rules are important. We will be generating class rules together and considering how we can help others to abide by these rules by setting a good example. We will discuss any worries or concerns we have as our brand-new year begins and establish our class team ethos.
