Our topic for the Summer term is Invaders and Settlers. We will begin our learning with the Ancient Romans. For your Home learning you can choose 2 of the options listed below to complete and bring back into school no later than 6th May.

Compare my leisure activities with the hobbies of Roman families.

Discuss the risks of being a gladiator.

Discuss how gladiators might have felt before, during and after a fight.



Compare aspects of the life of a **Roman child** with aspects of my life in Scotland today, e.g. food, clothing, toys and games.

Describe the differences between **Roman housing** and the houses that we live in today.

Research the characteristics typical of Roman roads and how important they were.

Explain the significance of the name 'Caledonia' within Scottish and Roman history.

Investigate the **structure** of the Roman army.



Use role play to explore and explain the role of a Roman Emperor.

Keep a steady beat using a musical instrument or clapping and marching in time to the beat.

Design and create a **Roman mosaic**. Draw a Roman house.



Participate in a hot-seating activity where I will ask questions of someone playing the part of a gladiator or a Roman Emperor.

Read information and answer questions about **Roman leisure activities**.

Write a newspaper article about the invasion of the Romans in Scotland.

Carry out a personal research project on an aspect of Roman life or a Roman ruler.

Read **unusual facts** about the Romans.



Make a 3D model of a Roman house.

Play a **game** matching Roman numerals to numbers.

Read and decode Roman numerals.

Use digital technologies to research and present information on a Roman ruler.
