Year 3 and 4 Half Term project—Autumn 2022

Skara Brae is a Stone Age settlement on Mainland, the largest island in the Orkney Isles, north of Scotland.

It was inhabited between roughly 3180BC until about 2500BC and is the most complete **Neolithic** site in Europe.

In 1850 there was a very big storm, which blew away the earth that had been hiding the Stone Age houses at Skara Brae. Because the soil had covered the houses, they had been well preserved.

There are 10 houses that have been cleaned and preserved and people can go and visit them today.

Your project is to create a model, a poster or a piece of writing about Skara Brae.

If you want to make a model, choose one of the ten houses on Skara Brae, make it to scale, and include labels to show what each part of the house was for.

If you want to make a poster, you can include maps, diagrams and pictures. Don't forget to write about what you have found out too. You should also include a map to show where Skara Brae is in the UK.

If you want to write about Skara Brae, you could pretend to be a Stone Age person and write a diary about your daily life. Make sure you write more than one entry to write about more than one day and explain what life was really like, and the sort of things a Stone Age person would have done.
